**PHYSICAL OR MENTAL CONDITIONS WHICH HAVE A HIGH  
PROBABILITY OF RESULTING IN A DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY**

*The following conditions, while not exhaustive, are indicators of eligibility of Early Intervention service (birth to three years)*

- ❑ Attachment disorder (severe)
- ❑ Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)
- ❑ Absence of limbs
- ❑ Apraxia
- ❑ Asphyxia (severe)
- ❑ Autism
- ❑ Brachial plexus injury
- ❑ Bronchopulmonary dysplasia
- ❑ Cerebral Palsy
- ❑ Chromosomal abnormalities (i.e., Down Syndrome, Fragile X Syndrome, Klinefelter's Syndrome, Prader-Willi Syndrome, William's Syndrome, Tay Sach's Syndrome, and others)
- ❑ CMV
- ❑ Deformity of limbs
- ❑ Failure to thrive
- ❑ Fetal Alcohol Syndrome
- ❑ Gestational age of under 26 weeks at birth
- ❑ Grade III and IV intraventricular hemorrhage (IVH or bleed)
- ❑ Hearing impairment (bilateral or unilateral of an extent that would impede language development)
- ❑ Head injury
- ❑ Hydroanecephaly
- ❑ Infants born weighing under 1500 grams (3 lbs. 5 oz.)
- ❑ Linear sebaceous nevus sequence
- ❑ Metabolic Disorder (i.e., PKU, Hurler's Syndrome)
- ❑ Microcephaly
- ❑ Mitochondrial Disorder
- ❑ Noonan's Syndrome
- ❑ Periventricular Leukomalasia (PVL)
- ❑ Pervasive Developmental Disorder (PDD)
- ❑ Prolonged hospitalization for any medical condition
- ❑ Regulatory Disorders
- ❑ Retinopathy of prematurity (ROB levels 3 and 4)
- ❑ Seizure disorder (with neurologic impairment)
- ❑ Shaken baby syndrome
- ❑ Shunt
- ❑ Spina Bifida (not occulta)
- ❑ Structural abnormalities of the brain (holoprosencephaly, lissencephaly)
- ❑ Torticollis
- ❑ Vision impairment (CVI, Severe ROP)
